For a student to be admitted to Bethesda Christian School, the parent must embrace the Christian philosophy of education that is preeminent at Bethesda, and the student should demonstrate potential to be successful in the classroom.

TOUR BETHESDA

All prospective students and their families are encouraged to schedule a tour of the school. Please schedule an appointment by visiting bethesdachristianschool.org/admissions or by calling 817.581.5131.

SUBMIT AN APPLICATION

Complete an online application.

The following items are required in order for an application to be complete:

- A Non-Refundable Application Fee of \$100
(Payment for an online application can be made via credit card only.)
- School Records – Transcripts, current standardized test results, and report cards.
- References – References are required from the student's current principal or school counselor, teacher(s), and pastor or youth pastor. Applicants must provide email contact information for these individuals, so that Bethesda can send reference forms to them.

COMPLETE A STUDENT ASSESSMENT (TK-12)

Once your application has been submitted, our admission office will contact you to schedule an entrance assessment.

SCHEDULE FAMILY INTERVIEW

Parents of prospective applicants are required to have an interview with the principal. A separate interview is required for all middle- and high-school applicants. An interview is scheduled only after the application process has been completed.

ADMISSION NOTIFICATION AND ENROLLMENT

Applicants are notified of the admission office's decision within two weeks after an interview with the principal has been conducted.

Once admitted to Bethesda, applicants will receive an offer email outlining steps to complete enrollment. Our admissions office will guide you through enrollment. A non-refundable enrollment fee (\$200 for Preschool; \$500 for TK-12) must be submitted to complete enrollment. We also require medical documentation, such as a certified copy of a birth certificate and an immunization record.

LEARNING SUPPORT

Learning Support is available to students with a diagnosed learning difference. If a student applies to Bethesda with a pre-diagnosed learning difference, it is the parent's responsibility to provide the most up-to-date evaluation or ARD paperwork to the admissions office. The office will read over the report and assess to what extent accommodations can be provided to meet the student's needs. If a student requires an evaluation for a learning difference while attending Bethesda, the Learning Support Coach will help to coordinate evaluations through Birdville ISD with the participation of parents and teachers. Once the evaluation is completed, it will be determined which accommodations may be provided for the student. Access to additional services may incur additional fees.
